HyLife Back Forty

The HyLife Back Forty is a multi-use trail park that provides fun for all ages. Located at Neepawa's north end, this 5.1 km cycling course involves increasing levels of difficulty and is open year round for cycling, fat biking, walking/running, tobogganing, cross-country skiing and snowshoeing.



ArtsForward

ArtsForward has an Art Gallery and Artisan Space that exhibit artists work from around the world. Their programming includes culturally significant events such as Indigenous Culture Day in September, visual & performing arts such as the ArtFest event hosted each summer, and education involving art, health & environmental sustainability.



Roxy Theatre
